Māori sometimes gave kauri names, such as Tāne Mahuta - who is Lord of the Forest. And no wonder! Kauri can grow to **60 metres high** and live for up to **2000 years!**

KAURI UNPER ATTACK

Our kauri forests aren't what they used to be ...

Humans have chopped down nearly all of the original kauri forest and now kauri face a new danger called kauri dieback!

Kauri dieback is a disease caused by tiny **spores** in the soil that attack the **roots** and **trunk** of kauri so that they starve to death!

Hundreds of kauri have been killed by this disease in the last few years, so it's very important we protect the few kauri we have left!
